Thanks to the unstinted support from the generous donors and esteemed volunteers, Vidya Poshak could venture into new vistas this year as envisaged during the previous year apart from maintaining the momentum as for the ongoing programmes. While the learnings from the past again steered us into treading on the earlier paths vis a vis existing programmes, the questions that hovered amongst the stakeholders drove the organisation to exploring newer horizons.

The online test that was experimented during the previous year to screen the academic talents for financial assistance led us to realise that many students, especially the rural ones struggled to cope up. This propelled us to go back to the written test mode where the rural student community could unleash their potential.

Through immense brainstorming, we tried to answer a question do we also wish to recognise and nurture the co-curricular talents such as music, dance, sports, etc? Upon considering the vibes of the stakeholders, Vidya Poshak decided to pilot fostering budding talents in co-curricular arenas in Dharwad and Belagavi districts. The results are encouraging. The programme will soon be extended to other districts.

The intent to increase the intensity of engagement with the school children paved way to conceive a new initiative called Bala Vijnani, thanks to KPIT and department of education, Government of Karnataka who joined hands with us. It is heartening to note that during the very first year of implementation, 50 trained college youths took models depicting various science principles to children of 43 rural schools of Dharwad block and succeeded in arousing curiosity among 2500 school children!

As mulled over last year, Vidya Poshak embarked upon an important endeavour of creating a pool of lay counsellors with the kind help from Samadhana Trust, Bengaluru headed by renowned Psychiatrist Dr C R Chandrashekhar. Now 49 lay counsellors trained by the trust, have been offering free counselling services to the needy. Through this initiative Vidya Poshak intends to instil peace which in turn facilitates realising the true potentials of individuals.

The alumni of Vidya Poshak (Vidya Poshak Community) continued to get involved in various programmes of Vidya Poshak. Their contribution in the form of donating back monetarily went up by 37% compared to last year and the number of alumni donating went up by 65%. They also played a major role in raising funds through Letzhange, an online fund raising platform, through which a whopping Rs.17 lakhs were raised within just 50 days from 1590 unique donors! Vidya Poshak was the only CSO to cross the target of 1500 unique donor mark amongst 83 contenders across the nation!

On the Resource mobilisation front Vidya Poshak could mobilise Rs. 27.6 millions during the current year which was 18% higher than the previous year.

All the above feats couldn't have been accomplished without the splendid support from committed volunteers who stood solidly with Vidya Poshak and contributed incredibly in all respects. We are immensely grateful also to all the individual and institutional donors who have been fuelling the programmes relentlessly en route to emboldening the education fraternity. Else, we couldn't have dreamt of an investment of Rs. 360 millions thus far! Nevertheless, we need more to assist more.



2. Programmes

2.1 Financial assistance

2.1 A Nurture Merit (Academic)



Vidya Poshak's flagship Nurture Merit Program provides financial assistance in the form of college fees, transportation and exam fees to students pursuing professional as well as non-professional courses. The objective of this program is to provide bright, but financially underprivileged students financial assistance. The identification of students

is done in a unique way through physical visits by volunteers to dwelling units of students to assess the need. This ensures only deserving receive the assistance.

Since inception, VP has disbursed more than INR 160 million towards financial assistance. More than 16,000 students have been assisted from several districts of Karnataka. The progress of each student is closely monitored throughout the support period.

First time financial assistance

In the FY 2017-18, Vidya Poshak received more than 2600 applications for financial assistance for pursuing higher education. Out of those 1400 applications were by students joining pre university course, and 1236 applications were by students joining graduate courses. We conducted examination for students joining pre university courses and chose 700 candidates for house visits to assess their financial status. Out

of them 185 were given financial assistance. On the basis of marks obtained in the class 12 board examination 1200+ candidates were chosen for assessing their financial status. Out of them 275 students were awarded financial assistance. Twenty of these students joined professional courses and the rest joined other graduate courses. The rank obtained in CET/NEET



examination was also considered for students joining professional courses. Totally an amount of Rs 27.66 Lakhs was distributed amongst 460 students as financial






Renewal of Financial assistance-

During the year, an amount of Rs. 64.87 Lakhs was disbursed as renewal of financial assistance to 80 students pursuing professional courses and 882 students pursuing non professional courses.

During this academic year, the support to the students studying in nonprofessional course increased by Rs. 6.27 lakhs and while assistance for professional course increased by Rs. 8.81 lakhs compared to the previous year 2016-17.

The average amount of financial assistance to the students studying in non-profession courses like PUC, BA,BSC,B.com was 5,827/-and the average amount of professional courses like Engineering and medicine was 17,753/-

2.1 B Junior Nurture Merit program

With the support of Tata Motors Ltd., the financial assistance program for the high school students of selected villages was continued this year as well. Overall 200 students applied for the support from the seven villages around TML Dharwad plant. House visit was done by the Vidya Poshak volunteers to assess the economic status of the families and finally 100 students were shortlisted for the support. Among these 53were studying in 10° class and the rest in 9° class.

Financial assistance program for selected students was conducted in TML premises on 18th April 2018. The officials of Tata Motors were in full praise for the services of Vidya Poshak.

2.1 C Nurturing Extra Curricular Talent (NExT)

From the current year, Vidya Poshak conceived the idea of nurturing the extra/co curricular talents of youth. The programme provides space for supporting deserving students to pursue excellence in non academic areas. To begin with it was decided to pilot the programme in Dharwad and Belagavi districts.

Through this programme, budding young artists are preferred to be assisted. For the pilot year, we considered the following three disciplines and depending on the results, we may add more disciplines next year.

- 1. Music Indian Classical form
- 2. Sports Individual Events only Indoor / Outdoor
- 3. Dance Indian forms







Eligibility Criteria

- The parents of aspirants should be dwelling in Dharwad and Belagavi districts.
- Aspirants should have achieved credible/significant achievements or performances in those respected disciplines which will be verified and tested by the experts on behalf of Vidva Poshak.
- The aspirants should be continuing learning in the respective disciplines.
- Age limit: 14 to 24 years
- For high school going students, it is desired that the aspirants should complete 10th class of education.

Duration of Support

Assistance from Vidya Poshak to a candidate will be for a period of 2 to 4 years depending on the need and the same will be reviewed on yearly basis.

Panels of experts were formed for all the fields. Auditions were conducted for the aspirants and finally 16 budding talents were assisted in the field of Music and Dance. In sports, despite receiving applications, no aspirants could clear the eligibility criteria.

Technical Training at ekLakshya

The second phase of the training program is conducted at ekLakshya training center at KLE University campus, following are the training program details

Digital Electronics: The main objective is to provide a basic level of Digital Electronics knowledge and set the stage to perform the analysis and design of complex digital electronic circuits. Educated the students in digital electronics through numerous assignment on circuit analysis, group discussions, class presentations and interactions.

Basic Electronics: The students are trained in basic electronics through numerous assignment on circuit analysis, group discussions, class presentations and interactions.

C-Programming: The students are trained in fundamental C-programming for developing flow chart, algorithm and executing programs through classroom discussion, student presentation and seminars, group interactions and extensive hands-on training.

Problem solving: Problem are part of day today life. The one who solves the problems effectively in a short time has more chances of becoming successful in not only career but also in personal life. ekLakshya, thus focuses on imparting problem solving skills to students from the beginning of the training itself.

Different problem solving methods like unitary method, graphical method and to variable methods are taught to the students. The students are now capable of solving Level 3 problems which are very complicated ones.







Self-Learning: Self learning is a unique learning method imparted to students. The objective is to make students become continuous learners and making their basic concepts stronger. This also helps students develop inquisitiveness and questioning skills. The aim is to bring confidence among the students to ask questions without hesitation. The major focus is on learning rather than getting the answer. Then the students are taught sequencing the questions to understand the proper flow learning. The AKSF students have learnt to ask divergent and convergent questions. They have to still work on sequencing.

2.2 Skill Development Programmes

2.2.A. Residential Bridge Camps

Since inception in 2007, Residential Bridge Camps have proved time and again that they serve the purpose of bridging that crucial gap between what the students get to learn in their traditional schooling and what else the world expects from them. The world, we mean the professional and personal arenas. The soft skills / life skills that do not usually find place in today's curricula find place in the camps. Nevertheless the camps have seen evolution as well. While more resource persons have entered the Vidya Poshak fold, newer venues are getting added, thanks to the generous society that is recognising the value of such engagements with student community.

Since the inception of residential camps in the year 2007, a total of 168 camps have been organised so far impacting 8917 students.

While last year 10 camps were organised covering 547 students, 11 were conducted during the current year serving 605 students.

Unique features of the Residential Bridge camps

- All sessions are interactive so the participants are motivated to interact with the resource persons freely.
- Audio Visual aids used profusely to ensure that the message penetrates
- Hands on leadership roles assigned to students throughout the camp. There will be various committees formed such as food, sanitation, stage, hospitality to resource persons, etc. The students remain part of a committee for 24 hours and don the role of other departments the following day.
- It is ensured deliberately that the sessions include activities to break the monotony and also to re energise the participants. The activities are debriefed to convey the messages pertaining that particular session.
- Horde of useful books made available through an open library, which the students access during their free time.
- Reflection sessions held at the end of each day's sessions when students write charts in a creative way depicting their take aways for the day.
- Various achievers are invited to the camps and students get to hear their success stories and hurdles they had to cross en route to success. The students obviously get inspired upon seeing the role models physically.







- The students pursuing degree courses are taken for exposure visits to industries and get acquainted with the entrepreneurship and the economics involved there in and thus an attempt is made to make the students understand the market dynamics.
- Students do yoga every morning that keeps them fresh the whole day physically and mentally. The session intends to inculcate the habit of getting up early and exercise.
- The participants thank all the sections of society and nature every day before having food. This practice is to bring in a sense of gratitude among the student community towards those who are responsible for the well being of the humans.
- Camps are conducted in diverse ambiance to foster adaptability among the students. The students get exposed to different food, weather, language, culture, etc.
- The participant spectrum is always diverse to facilitate cross learning.
- Exclusive camp coordinators (a male and a female) taking care of students 24 x 7
- Closing ceremony managed entirely by participants
- Camps are always conducted at serene venues. Venues that are away from noise, traffic and other distractions are preferred.

Facilities Provided

- Separate girls and boys hostel
- Food and snacks
- Bus fare to and from camp
- Daily English newspapers
- Open Library Facility

Objectives of camps

- The Vidya Poshak camps aim to foster life skills that are not fully available in the students' life either on campus or in their community.
- To facilitate students to be more successful in personal and professional life
- To instil confidence through interactive life skills workshops, develop self esteem and enabling to get rid of inferiority complex
- To encourage development of English communication
- To promote the idea that each student can become a leader
- To assist the students to set and achieve desired career goals
- To foster cross learning and adaptability
- To instil a sense of gratitude
- To enlighten the students on their rights and responsibilities including social responsibility.

Each camp has specific objectives decided prior to each camp based on the target group.

2.2 B. Other Skill Development Programmes

a. IIT-JEE Training Program

Vidya Poshak joined hands with Avanti Learning Centre in 2015 to offer IIT/JEE training to the meritorious students. First batch was a big success. We had 12 students out of 24 students clearing the JEE mains and three students cleared JEE Advanced. These three students got admission in IIT Dharwad, IISER Pune and IfST Trivandrum.



b. Bala Vijnani Program

Vidya Poshak took an initiative to kindle passion towards science among the school going children with the help of 'Easy to make' and 'Fun to Learn' scientific toys in the year 2017. This concept has been developed by KPIT which has also been assisting Vidya Poshak in implementing the programme. This programme is being delivered for the children studying in 7th and 8th class essentially in the rural government schools. Training is offered to student volunteers pursuing degree courses preferably with science background. These volunteers prepare science models that portray a particular scientific principle and deliver sessions at the schools and explain how these principles can be applied in day to day life. These sessions are essentially interactive and arouse intense curiosity among the children.

Initially Vidya Poshak student volunteers showed interest to participate in the program and dedicate 5-6 hours in a week. KPIT is offered training for the student volunteers, 50 student volunteers participated in the Training of Trainers (ToT) program. Trained volunteers divided into different teams and each team took responsibility of provide training for 5 schools.

Reach of the year

- 50 Student volunteers served as resource persons.
- Covered 43 schools and trained children in 52 batches

The annual event was organised on 28th February, 2018. All the participant schools were invited. Competitions were organised between the children of the schools. One pair of children from each school was allowed to participate in the competitions. They were asked to bring the raw materials and prepare models on selected science principles in front of the judges. The children were finally asked to explain the models.

The best six models won prizes. The event was held at Utsav hall of the prestigious JSS college campus of Dharwad. Renowned Scientific Officer (Rtd.) from BARC, Tarapur Shri Shridhar Udagatti, and personnel from KPIT were the judges.

C. Carving out Counsellors Training Program

Considering the huge need of Counselling, Vidya Poshak has embarked upon a new initiative called "Carving out Counsellors" training programme. The programme aims at training potential personnel in the 'Art of Counselling'. Jubilant.

Vidya Poshak organized the training for the first batch in association with 'Samadhana Trust' Bengaluru headed by Dr. C R Chandrashekhar. Through the first batch conducted in June-July 2017, a total of 28 participants from different places working in different sectors have been trained. In the second batch totally 21 participants have been trained. More such training programs have been planned. These trained counsellors have started offering personal counselling service to the needy.


