Year 2021-22 continued to be COVID Year. Thanks to our scientists and Governments who created and enabled vaccination of majority of Indians, situation now seems to be under control. However the most part of the year was fraught with fear and uncertainty.

Virtual classes were conducted for some classes but due to digital divide many students couldn't take benefit of it. We understand the after effects of COVID on our students and wish to make all out efforts to help them minimize the damage.

Operating Highlights - Covid Relief activities

The 2nd wave of Coronavirus caused much more severity to the society than the previous one in the last year. The pandemic disproportionally affected the lives of the people surviving on temporary/ daily wage livelihoods. There are families with ZERO income struggling to bring food to their tables.

Our responses with the support from donors are

- ✓ Total grants of INR 64,09,016 spent as an emergency response reaching out to 5000+ beneficiaries.
- ✓ Provided 25 beds and essential medical kits to different Govt. Primary health centers & hospitals in Gadag district with support from Visteon Corporation
- ✓ An emergency financial support of INR 30,000 each for 20 families which lost their bread winners with support from GiveIndia earning members

Till this date 16500+ students have been reached through our financial assistance program for which we have invested INR 30.00 Crore.

Digital Services & Mentoring: Students will be connected with mentors to get required guidance and also various digital services for skill development will be provided to the students.

With the support of Neuroglia Health Private Limited (Dailyrounds) FY-21-22, **59** students were supported with tune of **INR 177** lakh for their entire Engineering and Medical courses. Operating Highlights - Vidya Poshak Yuva Fellowship

Number Impacted- 478 students

Amount supported: 13.51Lakh

Major Donors: Synopsys India Private Limited and GiveIndia

Our Vision through fellowship program is to provide Excellent Education to every child in Karnataka. We aim to provide an opportunity to passionate, committed and most promising young graduates from local communities to serve as full-time teachers to children from low-income communities in Karnataka's most under-resourced Govt. schools. The teaching fellow will spend 2 years teaching in rural government school as a full time teacher teaching Mathematics and Science Subjects. In Long term our alumni will become advocates of Excellent Education & work for Educational Equity.

Yuva Fellowship program launched in July 2021, after three rounds of interview we welcomed six fellows onboard to start their fellowship journey. In July, one month training institute has taken place to give right set of Knowledge, skill and mindset to the fellows to teach in schools. In training we covered four major parts- Induction to the sector and organization, Culture and relationship building with stakeholders, Content and Pedagogy. Sessions were engaged by Teach for India and TFIx team, Vidya Poshak team and local facilitators.

Four rural government schools are allocated to six Yuva fellows. They started their teaching journey from Aug 1st and reaching 478 rural students.

Initially fellows visited students' houses to build rapport with stakeholders and conducted ASER survey to know students better. After doing ASER survey it become easy to know the students level in Maths and reading.

As schools are re-opened for higher primary classes, they could able to build classroom culture and values for the students. Along with teaching science and maths, practical sessions are attracting students and weekly once vision related activities are taken place.

Fellows involved in all the National festivals with their students. Independence day, Republic day and Children's day. Vidya Poshak conducted competitions for children and distributed prizes. The National Science day celebrated through quiz, drawing and science model exhibitions by the students.

The documentation is done by Fellows on daily basis. The Program manager and Fellow mentor are checking and giving feedback on daily Lesson plans, PPTs, daily tracker, attendance, daily reflection journal, blogs.

Class observations and debrief sessions/feedback session are regularly going on by Program Manager to improvise teaching. In all the schools Parents meeting and parents circle were organized to address the attendance issue.

Every alternate week we are doing Learning circles and development dialogues to discuss important development issues related to education. In Learning Circle all

fellows and Program manager will come together and discuss about essential topics which makes all the participants to share their experience and views.

TFIx director Ms. Rajashri Doshi and team visited our fellows' school and community. She discussed with all the fellows and given inputs & clarified fellows doubts. TFIx team given positive feedback to the fellowship and Vidya Poshak team.

We are proud to say that one of our Intern Alumni got selected for TFIx project called "Leadership India Needs" and given interview about her impact journey as a fellow/intern teacher.

We are happy to share that with Slam out loud/Girl Raising organization we have done new project 'Meri awaaz' to create space for students' voice through art, poetry and storytelling. Fellows are taking eight sessions in eight weeks to bring positive change in students' mindset on girl child Education.

We are thankful to ThinkTac team for providing training to our fellows and science experiment materials to all our students as children are enjoying and learning through science experiments every week. Fellows are facilitating all four science experiments to each class and recording students' observation.

Under eVidyaloka digital school program 33 Digital schools are been operated by Vidya Poshak scholars and benefiting 163 rural government school students studying in 6th Std. to 8th Std.





Operating Highlights - eVidyaloka

Number Impacted- 1605 students

Amount supported: 26.05 Lakh

Major Donors: eVidyaloka and GiveIndia

Government school students are getting digital classroom experience of Science, Maths and English subjects through eVidyaloka. eVidyaloka classes are going on through passionate volunteer teachers in all 23 centres. Once schools are reopened there was a huge learning gap which we have focused through regular classes and students are coming to school for attending digital classes now. Through this program 1605 students are getting benefit in academic year 2021-22. 90 volunteer teachers are serving eVidyaloka students through online classes. Students' regular attendance is 86% and it increased compared to Learn from Home classes.

Apart from online classes students are engaged in extra activities like Social Emotional Learning sessions (SEL), Students reading program, National Students Innovation Challenges (NSIC), Literature curriculum (LC), Drawing competition, V-GNYAN competition. National Science day celebrated in all the school on 28th February, students prepared different models of science.

In eVidyaloka National Partner Summit (NPS), Vidya Poshak got two awards as Best partner for digital classroom and digital school (Winner and runner up).











Operating Highlights - Payana

Number Impacted- 67 students

Financial Support: 6.21 Lakh


Major Donors: CAF America and Individual Donors

Payana is a journey of Educational Empowerment of girl students from single women led families. This is collaborative program with RAPID organisation. The support is unconditional irrespective of the Merit or the course the students are studying. In the 2021-22, 32 new students were identified and provided support along with 34 renewal students. All these 66 Payana students have been provided orientation and guidance along with their Educational support of INR 7.0 Lakhs Along with scholarship we supported girls with Library books, different trainings, financial assistance in covid period and grocery kits.

Online orientation program is conducted to give information to all the students about Vidya Poshak. Last month webinar was conducted on Adolescent and mental health topic to address the adolescent issues and to create awareness on counseling.







Operating Highlights - Susandhi

Number Impacted: 70 Financial Support: 40.70 Lakh

Major Donors: Texas Instruments, Analog Devices and Vibha India

Abdul Kalam Susandhi Fellowship program is a unique program designed to impart technical skills along with exemplary behavioral skills. This is the only program in India in which 12th standard science students are trained in high-end technology areas and cost of the full training is covered.

Six trainees joined Batch 11 and the training commenced on 23rd Nov 2021. Currently they are undergoing soft skills training at Deshpande Educational Trust. From April'22 to Oct'22, the trainees will undergo technical training with ekLakshya Innovation Labs.

Seven trainees joined batch 10 and the training commenced on 5th Oct 2020. Trainees have completed the one year training. One trainee is undergoing internship with Merahkee Technology Solutions a company working in software product development. Five trainees have completed VLSI training in ekLakshya.

Twenty-two trainees joined batch 9 and the training commenced on 3rd Sept 2019. All of them are currently undergoing industrial internship.

Sixteen Trainees Joined the program and training commenced on 3rd Oct 2018. All of them are currently undergoing industrial internship.

Nine trainees joined this batch and the training commenced on 3rd Oct 2017. The trainees have completed eight months of technical training conducted by ekLakshya. All of them are currently undergoing industrial internships. Eight trainees are selected for internship with Sankalp semiconductor [VLSI] and one trainee is with Vegam Solutions.





Operating Highlights - Counseling Program

Number Impacted: 206

Amount supported: 3.77 Lakh

Personal counselling can help an individual to increase self-confidence, improve relationships, solve problems, achieve educational goals, and make good decisions for emotional, intellectual and physical well-being. The youngsters/teenagers are facing several problems in day to day life and there is a huge need of addressing these problems. To enable this Vidya Poshak has launched Personal Counseling program in 2021. Through Personal counselling program we are mainly focusing on counselling interventions to resolve academic issues as well as personal issues of youths.

- **Personal Counseling Interventions:** From May 2021 to March 2022, we have reached 206 counselling interventions and it is ongoing with follow up sessions. And we have addressed academic issues, relationship issues, Sleep disturbances, Adjustment problems, Anxiety, fear of exam and fear about future and so on.
- Lay Counselors Training: With the collaboration of Prasanna Counseling Center, Bangalore we conducted Lay Counselors training for 58 participants; among them more than 15 participants were willing to contribute volunteer service for Counseling Program.
- **College seminars:** We have visited 23 different colleges and have addressed students on various topics like Exam fear and Positive study habit, Concentration enhancing techniques, Emotion management etc

Webinars for VP students and other stakeholders: Due to pandemic situation we have focused more on webinars in order to reach student community and other stakeholders like parents, teachers and Lay-counsellors. We are receiving all kinds of support and encouragement from different stakeholders.









Operating Highlights - Knowledge Resource Centers

Number Impacted- 1385 students

Amount supported: 17 Lakh

Major Donor: GiveIndia, Your Cause, Benevity and Individual donors

We continued to support rural economically challenged youth & students through our Libraries & Knowledge Resource Centers. The following services are being provided to students through our six KRCs located at Dharwad, Sirsi, Belagavi, Davanagere & Vijayapur

Access to Books: The student community could access books which included academic as well as those related to cracking competitive examinations. Students have been provided books for their home use.

Computer and Internet: The students were also provided computer and internet facility. The student could practice and operate various Programing languages and also able to use for practice of their academic syllabus and researching for academic requirements.




